NOTES:

Transfer credit: Maximum of 60 credits of transfer credit may be applied to the B.A. degree.

Time Limitation: The degree must be completed within a maximum of 8 years. Upon written request, time extensions may be granted at the discretion of the Academic Dean.

Christian Service: B.A. students are required to complete at least six semesters of Christian Service.

Juniors and Seniors may substitute PP 411/412 Supervised Ministry or PM 322 Cross-Cultural Ministry Internship for their senior year Christian Service.

B.A. students pursuing a *second major* or a *minor* should complete coursework as indicated below. Three elective courses in Biblical and Theological Studies will be substituted by Professional Education courses. A double major requires a minimum of 126 credit hours.

General Christian Ministries Concentration

Major requires 24 credits; Minor requires 18 credits

Christian Ministry students may choose to take either PE 201 Principles of Teaching or PP 301 Homiletics.

All Christian Ministry students are required to take the following courses:

Any 2 Christian Education courses

Any 2 Missions courses

Any 2 Pastoral Ministry courses

Majors must complete one *additional* course from any of the three areas of concentration. Minors complete only one course in one of the three areas.

** Individual requirements for the General Christian Ministry concentration may be modified at the discretion of the Academic Dean.*

Missions Concentration

Major requires 24 credits; Minor requires 18 credits

All Mission students may choose to take either PE 201 Principles of Teaching or PP 301 Homiletics.
